FUNDRAISING

Treasure Trove – The Treasure Trove is our thrift shop which is open to campus residents and the public. All sorts of clothing, furniture, jewelry, books, decor and more are sold. Donations can be placed in a bin behind the store. This project is operated by off-campus volunteers and is open on Wednesdays, Saturdays and the first Friday of the month. Credit cards are accepted.

The Manor Shoppe - Located in the Freeman Community Center, this gift/convenience store features items such as greeting cards, decorations, fashion accessories, home items, chocolates/candy and grocery items. The Manor Shoppe is open Monday through Saturday and accepts credit cards. It is operated by volunteers.

Crafters – A very creative group of workers who meet on Monday afternoons to make a wide variety of crafts which are sold at our meetings and special events. All are welcome to join the group to relax, meet others and be productive at the same time. Funds raised from sales are donated to benevolent care.

Gift Card Sales - This popular and successful fund raiser held in the spring and fall, features cards from a large variety of retailers at different price points. These sales events coincide with gift-giving seasons and make great presents.

Blooms & More Festival – This event, occurring in early May spotlights plants (many of which were raised at our organic Trailside farm), crafts, baked goods and homemade fudge. The festival, also open to the public, features a silent auction with donated items, artwork and themed baskets.

Theatre Event - Thanks to Bonnie and John Stangl for coordinating this summer project featuring the Lebanon Community Theatre's show "Guys and Dolls." A preperformance reception was held in the Skylight Dining room and patio. We appreciate the ongoing support by Jonestown Bank.

HEALTH CENTER PROGRAMS & PROJECTS

Transporters – We have a dedicated team of volunteers who transport residents from their rooms to Worship Services, the Beauty Shop and other special events within the Health Center.

Shoppe on Wheels – Volunteers take the *Shoppe on Wheels* cart to residents in all four Health Center households on Fridays. This provides valuable social contact with Health Center residents as well as the opportunity to purchase candy, snacks and greeting cards.
